

## NOVEMBER 28, 2011 WHEATLAND TOWN BOARD MEETING

Meeting was called to order by Chairman William Glembocki at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, November 14, 2011 at the Town Hall in New Munster. He opened the meeting with the *Pledge of Allegiance*.

Town Board members present – Chairman Glembocki and Supervisors Andrew Lois and Robert Herda. Others present: Clerk Sheila Siegler, Municipal Judge Fred Hewitt, Constable Bob Haas, Jim Mirek, Alan Kaddatz, Bill Heeg, West of the I reporter Darren Hillock, and Candidate for Circuit Court Judge, David Berman

Notices were posted in six public areas and the town website. The *Kenosha News* and *Westosha Report* were notified. Individuals who have requested meeting notices by e-mail were also sent agendas as required by state law.

Robert Herda moved approval of the November 7, 9, and 10, 2011 Town Board Meetings. Andrew Lois seconded. Motion carried.

- **Fire Dept.** – Chairman said we have nothing on the 911 memorial and the Chief is unable to be here tonight. The furnace replacements have been ordered for the firehouse. Hopefully, we will have something for the December 12<sup>th</sup> meeting.

- **Public Comments** – David Berman, Pleasant Prairie, a candidate for Circuit Court Judge addressed the town board and the audience. He gave a short presentation on his background and his qualifications for circuit court judge. He said there are five candidates so far. The primary election will be February 21 and the spring election on April 3.

Chairman asked if the board felt the orange flags on the 25 mph signs could be removed. Supervisor Herda said he preferred they remain for a while. Chairman said he is asking Kenosha County to place orange warning flags on the stop sign and the stop ahead sign for northbound traffic on County “KD” for the stop sign approaching Geneva Rd. There have been several accidents because of people not stopping on “KD.”

Chairman Glembocki said he will be attending a December 13 TRIP meeting at the Kenosha County Center.

Chairman also reported the temporary salt shed located in the transfer station area is complete and ready to go
