

CHAPTER XXX.

CRIMINAL CONDUCT

SECTION 30.00. Provisions of State Law Adopted by Reference. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Code, the statutory provisions in Chapters 941 to 948 of the Wisconsin Statutes, describing and defining regulations with respect to:

- Crimes Against Public Health and Safety (941)
- Crimes Against Reputation and Civil Liberties (942)
- Crimes Against Property (943)
- Crimes Against Sexual Morality (944)
- Gambling (945)
- Crimes Against Government and its Administration (946)
- Crimes Against Public Peace, Order and Other Interests (947)
- Crimes Against Children (948)

Chapters 941 to 948 are by reference made a part of this code as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any regulation incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this Code.

SECTION 30.10. Future Amendments, Revisions, or Modifications of State Law. Any future amendments, revisions, or modifications of the statutory regulations in Chapters 941 to 948 incorporated herein are intended to be made part of this Code in order to secure to the extent legally practicable uniform statewide regulation of criminal conduct in the state of Wisconsin.

SECTION 30.20. Penalty. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed guilty of an offense and upon conviction thereof, shall forfeit not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00 and the cost of prosecution for each and every offense.
